

2020 Elections!

While these are unprecedented times for our state and country, open and fair elections represent the core of our democracy. Election planning must be carried out to support the constitutional right to vote, even in the face of this pandemic.

If you are unable to go to your poll place on Election Day, you may cast an Absentee Ballot during the 46 days prior to Election Day either at Ham Lake City Hall or Anoka County Elections.

State Primary Election – Tuesday, August 11

Absentee voting period:

June 28 – August 10

General Election – Tuesday, November 3

Absentee voting period:

September 18 – November 2

You can also contact Anoka County Elections at 763-324-1300 to get an Absentee Ballot Application mailed to you. The ballot request allows voters to receive their State Primary and General Election Ballots through the mail.

Can I vote?

- must be at least 18 years of age on election day;
- a citizen of the U.S.;
- have lived in Minnesota for 20 days prior to election day;
- not be ineligible because of court order for being incompetent, under sentence for felony, etc.

You will need to update your registration any time you change your address or name. If you are not yet registered to vote at your current address, you can pre-register until July 21st at 4:30 p.m. if registering in person, or until midnight online. To pre-register, you can contact Ham Lake City Hall (763-434-9555), at Anoka County Elections, 2100 3rd Avenue, Suite W130, Anoka (763-324-1300) or download one at <http://www.anokacounty.us/245/Voter-Registration-Information>.

You may also register at the polling place on Election Day, with acceptable identification as allowed by state law.
